Purpose of Club Officer Training

It goes without saying that a Gyro Club, to operate efficiently, must have a capable, smooth-functioning set of officials, who know their jobs and perform them with vigor and dispatch.

While we don't take ourselves too seriously in Gyro, and while it is true that we believe in friendship above all else, when it comes to the officers of our Club (as well as to finances), we are in dead earnest, because no element of society can function well without a smooth-running organization. The Club officers are responsible for a sound business-like administration and it cannot be emphasized too strongly that it is wisdom itself to elect officers with great care, always keeping in mind the men best fitted to do the type of work needed, quite apart from personality.

A study of Club organizations reveals a great similarity in the detailed breakdown of responsibility. The most successful method of ensuring successful organization is that of giving to each officer direct responsibility for a definite and detailed job of work. As a guide, and with full realization that each particular Club may have specific local problems, we present the following guidelines that have proven useful in the successful operation of our Clubs.

Officers and Committees

The officer list of a Gyro Club generally consists of five Directors and four Officers, including President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer (some Clubs combine the secretary-treasurer into one job).

Elections are usually held in May with formal installation in June in order to conform to the Gyro International year.
