Welcome to Gyro International!

Congratulations on your decision to join Gyro International, a Fraternity of Friendship for over 100 years. You have had the good fortune to have been invited by a friend to share in the world of Gyro fun and to forge new friendships that could last you for a lifetime. As a new Gyro member, this letter will inform you about the history of the organization, our structure and also help provide an insight into the values and culture of Gyro International.

Founders.

Three college students, who graduated from Western Reserve University in Cleveland, Ohio, in 1912, decided to form a club in order to stay in touch after leaving school. They adopted the gyroscope as their symbol and called their club Gyro. The gyroscope turns on an axis and is impervious to outside influences just as a true friendship remains no matter what is happening around the world. Clubs are in the United States and Canada with the first Club chartered in Cleveland, Ohio in 1912 and internationally with the addition of Toronto, Ont. in 1919.

Structure.

We have three levels in the organization – Club, District and Executive.

At the Club level each club is able to operate within their own Constitution as long as it does not conflict with the Constitution and Bylaws of Gyro International or their Club's District. Dues are paid to support your Club, your District and Gyro International.

The affairs of Gyro are administered by a Board of Governors, which consists of Gyro Governor's from each District and the International Executive Committee. The Executive Officers include an Immediate Past President, President, 1st and 2nd Vice Presidents and Secretary-Treasurer. The Secretary-Treasurer oversees the organization's functions. The officers work on issues designed to improve the organization and promote the recruitment of new members.

There is a staff office in Painesville, Ohio that efficiently supports all Gyros with information, pins, certificates, and other items.

Conventions are the backbone of Gyro fun and friendship. An International convention is held annually, helping to bring together Gyro members from across North America while providing the opportunity for the Board of Governors to elect new Executive Council members and vote on any necessary changes to the Constitution and Bylaws.

District conventions are also held annually, creating the opportunity for members to meet somewhere closer to home while continuing to build and develop new Gyro friendships. Executive Officers serve as representatives to these District Conventions to help provide a link from Gyro International to the Club and District levels.

Circle of Friendship.

Friendship is an enduring affection founded upon mutual respect and esteem. A Harvard study showed that being involved with other people could add considerably to a person's life span. You are encouraged to travel to other clubs for their installation or a social get-together. By attending District and International conventions you will be able to expand your circle of friends. You will get much more out of the organization if you get involved and serve in your club's administrative staff and perhaps later as a District officer.

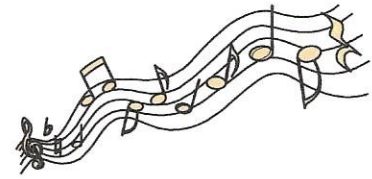

HELLO GYRO



Hello Gyro - you're a friend of mine

Over the years many of us have wondered about the words of our **"Hello Gyro"** song. It is sung often at Clubs, Districts and International. Several years ago some research was done to try and put in writing the original meaning of the words. Some of the long time Gyros who were sons of Gyro members put together the following meanings.

As you know gyro was founded by three college buddies, two of whom were fraternity brothers, resulting in the first two lines, **"Hello Gyro, you're a friend of mine."**

The third line, **"With your hand in your pocket,"** tells us that members of this organization do not have a hand out asking for something but rather dig deep to offer assistance to fellow members. We do not use our Fraternity for personal business gains.

At the time the fraternity was established (1912) the clothing style almost always included a vest. Since wristwatches were not very common, pocket watches were swagged to the other side where a small knife or some other item kept it in place. The "key" from your fraternity was worn in the center of this chain, thus the line **"And your little chain and locket."**

The first group of gyros met in the Alley Bar in Cleveland explaining the last line of the song, **"And he lives down in our alley."** Unfortunately, the Alley Bar no longer exists so a nostalgic trip to our roots is not possible.
